1. Amendments

1.1 It is proposed to make two minor updates to the Preferred Option document which is being considered by Cabinet and Council.

2. Timetable for next stages of preparing the Local Plan

2.1 The timetable for the future stages of the Local Plan contained in the report on page 24 and repeated in the Preferred Option Document at page 54 should be further updated to reflect the need for the Local Plan to take account of the latest population and household statistics to be made available during 2014. A revised timetable is attached as Figure 1.

3. Planning for travellers

3.1 Under the heading 'Formby area' on page 175, <u>delete sentence</u>:

'Sefton's only site for travellers is in Formby, at Green Lane, and Policy PC3 'Planning for Travellers' allocates an extension to this site as well as setting out the planning criteria for additional sites for travellers elsewhere'.

and replace with:

'Sefton's only existing site for travellers is in Formby, at Broad Lane, and Policy PC3 'Planning for Travellers' sets out the planning criteria for additional provision for travellers'.

3.2 The 'Planning for travellers' policy remains unchanged.
