2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

RESOLVED:

4. REISSUING OF SAFETY CERTIFICATES AT SOUTHPORT FC

The Committee considered the report of the Head of Economic Growth and Housing which sought Member's approval to re-issue Safety Certificates for two regulated viewing grandstands at Southport FC's Haig Avenue stadium, in order to include the name of the Club's new Secretary who will be the holder of the certificates. A Safety Certificate needed to be granted in accordance with the Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975 and the Fire Safety and Safety of Places Sports Act 1987.

Summary:

To seek Members' approval for the implementation of crossing improvements to the junctions of Weld Road and Shore Road with the Coastal Road in Birkdale and Ainsdale.

Recommendation(s):

It is recommended that the Head of Highways and Public Protection be authorised to implement the following modifications to the highway:

- (1) Amendment to the Geometry and Improved Crossing facilities at the junction of Weld Road and the Coastal Road in Birkdale
- (2) Amendments to the Geometry and improved crossing facilities at the junction of Shore Road and the Coastal Road in Ainsdale.

Reasons for the Recommendation(s):

The proposed crossing points form a key part of the Transpennine Trail. Provision of improved crossing points at these locations will improve safety for users of the Transpennine Trail and facilitate sustainable access to the Coast.

The crossings could be introduced at the Shore Road roundabout without the changes to carriageway alignment, but it was considered that a reduction in approaching traffic was essential to make the crossing points as safe and desirable to users as possible.

1. Introduction/Background

- 1.1 Improvements to the cycle path alongside the Coastal Path, which forms part of the Transpennine Trail were undertaken during the Spring/ Summer of 2020. These involved widening the path between Weld Road and the Railway Bridge just north of Pinfold Lane, through replacing stone drainage medium between the cycle path and main carriageway and surfacing it with a porous material consisting of primarily recycled tyres. As the laying of this material is temperature dependent, it was not possible to complete the works before the winter of 2020 and due to completing road works and a desire to keep the Coastal Road open during the Summer tourist season these works will be completed in September 2021.
- 1.2 The project has been funded by the Combined Authority through the Sustainable Urban Development fund and due to revised working practises has been delivered within budget. It is proposed to use the residual budget to complete the scheduled works in September and to undertake additional works to improve crossing facilities at the Coastal Road junctions of Weld Road and Shore Road.
- 1.3 Resurfacing of the Shore Road and Weld Road roundabout junctions with the Coastal Road have been identified as part of the 2021/2 Highway Maintenance Programme and it would be appropriate to undertake both improvements at the same time in order to minimise disruption.

2 Weld Road/ Coastal Road Roundabout

- 2.1 As shown on Drawing No DES-JA1465-LRC-001 (Annex A), it is proposed to undertake the following
 - Tighten the Marine Drive entry and exit lanes
 - Narrow the southbound circulatory lane from Marine Drive through to the Coastal Road
 - Narrow the Weld Road entry and exit lanes

This will improve visibility for pedestrians/ cyclists crossing these arms of the junction and reduce vehicle entry/ exit speeds from the junction to facilitate easier crossing of the roads in accordance with the latest design standards.

3 Shore Road/ Coastal Road Roundabout

- 3.1 As shown on Drawing No DES-JA1465-LRC-002 (Annex B), it is proposed to undertake the following
 - Tighten the Shore Road westbound entry and exit lanes of the junction
 - Narrow the southbound circulatory lane
 - Narrow the northbound circulatory lane after the Ainsdale Beach turn-off
 - Tighten the Coastal Road northbound entry and exit lanes of the junction
 - Introduce a zebra crossing on the Shore Road west arm of the junction utilising the wide central island to improve crossing facilities

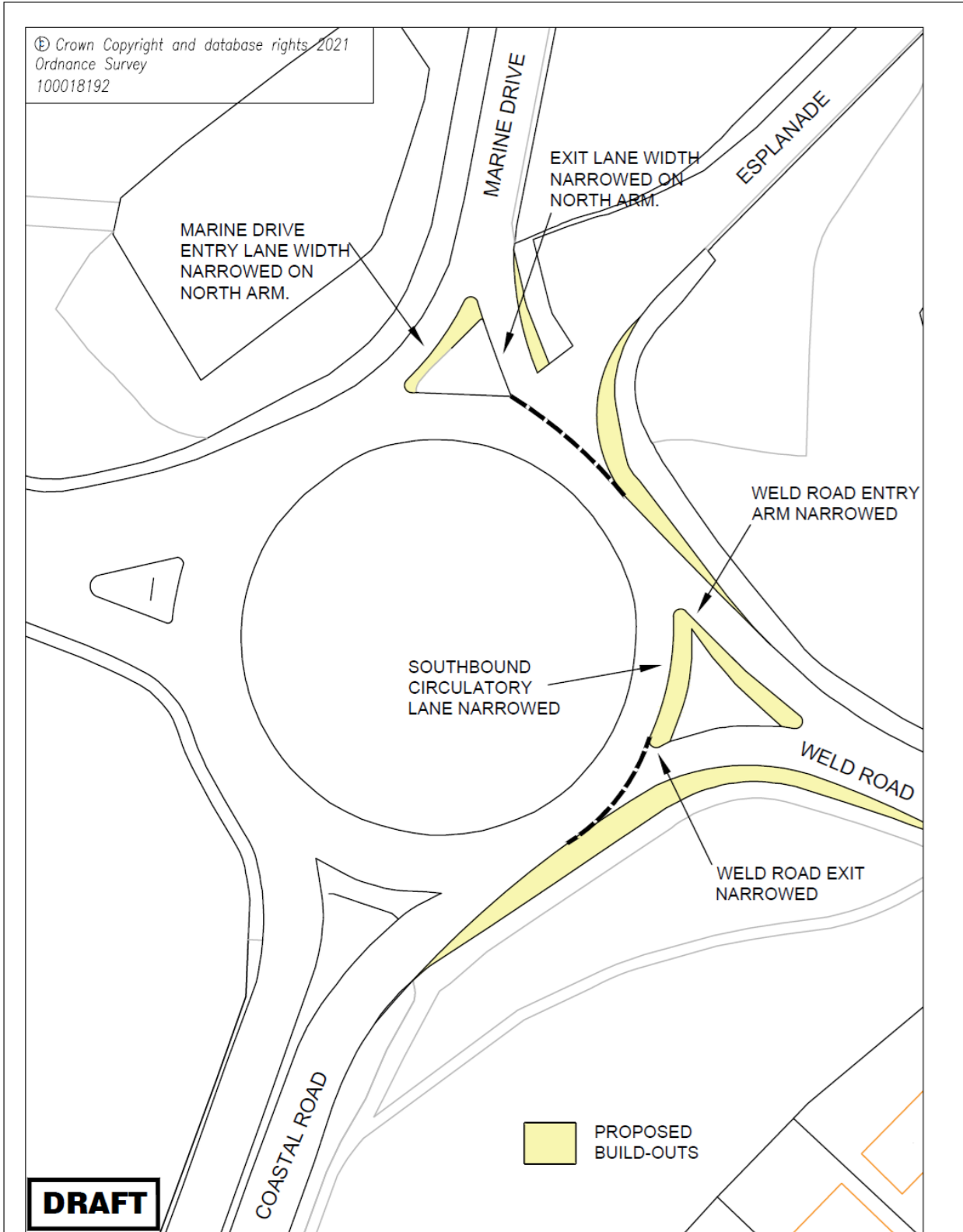
This will improve visibility for pedestrians/ cyclists crossing these arms of the junction and reduce vehicle entry/ exit speeds from the junction to facilitate easier crossing of the roads in accordance with the latest design standards.

4 Recommendations

4.1 It is recommended that the Head of Highways and Public Protection be authorised to implement the following modifications to the highway:

- (a) Amendment to the geometry and Improved Crossing facilities at the junction of Weld Road and the Coastal Road in Birkdale
- (b) Amendments to the geometry and improved crossing facilities at the junction of Shore Road and the Coastal Road in Ainsdale.

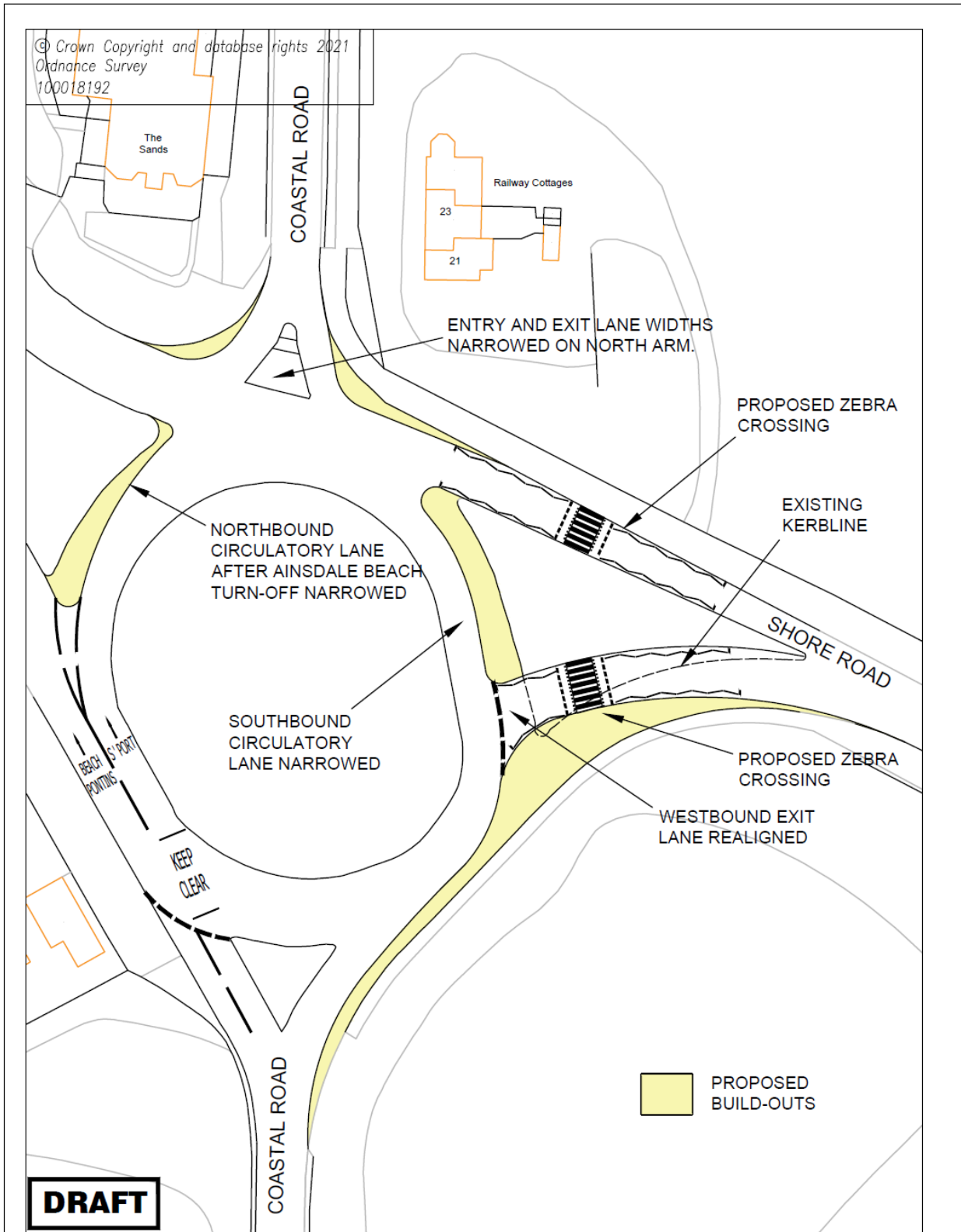
