Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1.No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence:-

a)At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
b)At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2.Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. 1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Any 'Off' Sales provision shall expire once the restrictions contained within The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) Regulations 2020 are lifted and the premises are allowed to re-open for 'On' Sales.

CCTV shall be provided in the form of a recordable system capable of providing good quality clear images in all lighting conditions. Cameras shall encompass all entrances, exits to the premises the rear yard and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment shall be maintained in good working order and correctly timed and dated. Recordings will be available for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on request in accordance with Data Protection Legislation.

The recording equipment being of a digital hard drive system shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the Premises Licence Holder or other responsible named individual.

There will be sufficient members of trained staff available to be able to download evidence with the minimum of delay at the request of the Police or Local Authority approved officer on reasonable request.

A 'Challenge 25' policy will be in operation at the premises in that persons who look under the age of 25 years are requested to provide proof of age by way of a photo driving licence, passport or PASS accredited proof of age card.

All staff responsible for alcohol sales must be trained in respect of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and in particular sales of alcohol to persons who are drunk or underage before they engage in the sale of alcohol. Refresher training shall be undertaken at least every 6 months. Records of training shall be retained for at least 12 months.

All the refusals for the sale of alcohol will be recorded in a refusals log/book kept at the premises to be made available to any Responsible Officer on request.

Persons under the age of 18years will be allowed on the premises until 1700hrs in company with a responsible adult who must be dining at the premises.

A hot food menu must be available at the premises until 2000hrs.

No open bottles/glasses or alcohol containers will be allowed to be taken outside the premises.

All incidents of Crime and Disorder will be recorded in an incident book to be kept at the premises and made available to a Responsible officer on reasonable request.

Toilet areas shall be monitored to ensure only one person can use them at all times.

Posters for drugs shall be erected throughout the premises and the premises shall work with local enforcement and councils to promote the safe sale of alcohol.

A clicker system shall be used for entrants to ensure that the maximum level of people is not exceeded inside the building.

Health and Safety policies and procedures shall be in place and inspections carried out daily/weekly throughout when relevant.

Accident books and first aid kits shall be kept fully stocked and shall be implemented for any incident whatsoever.

Licences shall also be held for electrical and gas equipment to include PAT testing of any equipment which is more than 12 months old.

All licences shall be obtained that are required and the relevant insurance shall be in place.

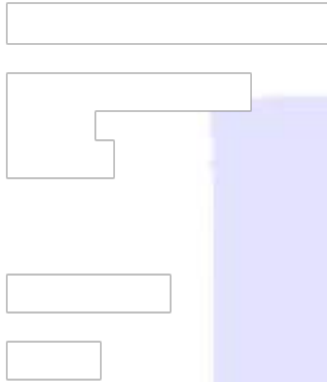
A Licence holder shall always be on site in order for staff to be secure and give security and safety to the public also.

Music shall not be allowed outside the premises and shall only be used as a background noise internally.

Clients shall be reminded via notice and verbally to leave the premises quietly in order to not cause a nuisance to residents.

Bins shall be emptied only at day time hours in order to keep the noise from the bottles etc to a minimum and deliveries will be requested after the hours of 10am and before 4pm to keep the noise from barrels etc disturbing local residents.

Sound proofing shall be in place in the premises to reduce any public noise and windows and doors shall be closed after 6pm to reduce noise level for local residents.
