Estimated outturn of KSI Casualties for Jan-Dec 09 is above the target of 85, based on 40 reported KSIs for Jan-May 09. However, this is an unconfirmed figure, and could be subject to change once verification exercises complete. Merseyside Police had previously identified an upward trend in KSIs caused by a reduction in Police enforcement during 2008 and the beginning of 2009. Robust enforcement procedures have now been put in place, but it will take several more months of casualty figures before it is established whether this is having the anticipated effect.
